

They are presented with certificates and a copy of their film. Many young people have been returning over a number of years to the programme, all aspiring film producers, directors, editors and film crew. The training course and film festival harnesses the energy and creativity of the young people involved and we are delighted to be able to screen rhe results of their hard work and enthusiasm.

The Festival also screens the successful short films from our Young Filmmakers Bursary Awards as part of our Emerging Filmmakers Programme. Running alongside this is our 2 day course on 'Producing a Short Film' sponsored by ArtLinks and faciliated by Filmbase.
